

Pastor's Pen

Dear church friends and family,

I was recently shopping in Gould's only to find that the store was closing early that day. They happened to be doing their yearly inventory that day, and had to close the store early to do it, only so they could stay late to do that work. At the time, when I heard that I thought "Well that must be the biggest pain in the tuckus." And it probably is. But it is also necessary to run a business to take stock of everything.

Taking stock of things is also necessary for the human soul. I almost feel like we are too busy these days. Everybody has the next thing to do, the next thing to get to, the next thing on the schedule always before them. We wear ourselves thin, but we never take the time to recover. We are too busy to take stock of our lives and where our God is at work in them. It just seems like it will take too much time or energy. But when we do take stock of God, it refreshes our very soul.

We're in the middle of a sermon series on baptism right now, and what our baptism means for us today. We're getting back to the basics this new year. And one of the basics is taking time to take stock of all the ways God is working in your life.

We see this reflected in the psalms. Psalm 136 tells us time and time again that God's love endures forever. "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good. His love endures forever. 2 Give thanks to the God of gods. His love endures forever. 3 Give thanks to the Lord of lords: His love endures forever. 4 to him who alone does great wonders, His love endures forever. 5 who by his understanding made the heavens, His love endures forever. 6 who spread out the earth upon the waters, His love endures forever. 7 who made the great lights— His love endures forever. 8 the sun to govern the day, His love endures forever. 9 the moon and stars to govern the night; His love endures forever."

This psalm is taking stock of all of God's goodness. It is full of the affirmation that signs that God's endures forever are all around you. Now the psalmist invites you to take stock too. What are the signs you see that God's love endures forever? And I want to be real now and say this will take a bit of time. And you might not feel like you have the time for it. But if you do take stock of God's love in your life, in the end you will know it is worth it. And you might even say happily along with the psalm, God's love endures forever. So take some time each day or each week, and take stock of God's love around you. It will be worth the time in the end.






Ash Wednesday- Wednesday February 22nd

Ashes to Go: During Lent we receive ashes to remind us of our need for God. The ashes represent that we are finite, we are mortal, and we make mistakes and sin. For all of that, we need a loving God. And we receive those ashes in the sign of the cross to remind us that the God we need loves us. If you can't join us for our Ash Wednesday worship service then come and receive ashes to go in our parking lot. Simply drive by in our parking lot and receive ashes and a blessing. There will be opportunities to receive ashes from 7:30am-9am and from 4:00pm to 5:30pm.



Ash Wednesday Worship: Our Ash Wednesday Worship Service will be Wednesday, February 22nd at 6:30pm. During Lent we receive ashes to remind us of our need for God. The ashes represent that we are finite, we are mortal, and we make mistakes and sin. For all of that, we need a loving God. And we receive those ashes in the sign of the cross to remind us that the God we need loves us. That is what we will focus on in worship to begin the season of Lent.

Heartwood Center

We are stepping up in our ministry with the Heartwood center, the local daytime homeless shelter in Hazleton. We are going up once a month to sit and eat with our friends, to share in life with our neighbors there, and sit with people in love just as Jesus did. Matthew 2:13 -17 tells us what Jesus ate with the people he called to be his disciples, as well as tax collectors, sinners, and the outcasts. This was part of how Jesus loved people and how he invited people to love him back. We are doing the same thing at the Heartwood center, following Jesus in these steps.

While we are up there we often hear about the concerns and needs of our neighbors and friends. Because we love them, we want to respond to their needs, their worries, and their stories.

We are going to be doing that in two ways, in addition to our monthly meals and activities at the Heartwood center.

The first is by collecting much needed supplies for our friends in these winter months. During our last visit there, we met a family who had a baby named Jzavier. His parents had to carry him around all day in one of those baby backpacks and have no place to stay at night. Kate Flaim, seeing this, immediately remembered that she had an old stroller in her garage. That same day we were able to deliver that stroller to that family, much to the comfort of little Jzavier and his parents. You can show the same kind of love as Kate by giving some supplies. Currently our friends need blankets, winter coats, scarves, and gloves, laundry detergent (the Heartwood center had laundry facilities), travel size toothpaste, sensitive skin deodorant, paper cups for coffee, and to go containers.

The second is by beginning a Bible study at the Heartwood Center called "Through Heaven's Eyes." In this informal Bible study we, together with our friends at the Heartwood Center, will learn to take a more loving and kinder look at ourselves by thinking about ourselves through the eyes of God. If you struggle with your self-worth, self-love, or the ability to forgive yourself, or if you struggled with those things in the past, this is a great opportunity to be drawn further into the love of God together with our friends at the Heartwood Center. This Bible study will begin at the end of February. We are still working out the date so keep on the lookout for our announcement about it soon.

All we are asking for is a donation and all proceeds will be given to the **Heartwood Center**.






We are in need of volunteers for the Nursery each week, please consider helping out. If we get enough volunteers it may only be once a month or every other month. See Brittany for additional information.

Our team is using an intentional process to prepare, assess, learn, and grow in their understanding of what it means to be a healthy, fruitful congregation in a post-pandemic world.

Who is our Coach Facilitator? Rev. Monica Guepet is an assisting elder in the North District and lead pastor of Stroudsburg United Methodist Church. She has two decades of experience in serving with congregations. Pastor Monica is an ordained elder in the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference, has served 5 congregations in different settings, and is married with three children

Why are we doing this? Vital congregations are led by and made up of vital disciples. These are some marks of vital disciples:

Disciples engage in growing their faith through small groups

Through the Vital Congregation Pathway, we will work with a facilitator to develop one of the vital congregation markers.

How long will this process take? The team and facilitator will work together for 12-18 months to develop a strong foundation and implement an action plan. Our Coach Facilitator will resource us and hold us accountable.

Does this cost anything? The coach facilitator and access to resources is a part of your Connectional Ministry Fund contributions, so it's free!

What can I do? Pray for which pathway we are being called to at this time. Pray for our church family and our community.
