Pastor's Pen

Dear church friends and family,

There is one thing I love to do on my days off above all others. I love to go hiking. I love spending time in the woods. I love looking at the trees sway in the breeze. I love the sun shining through leaves. I love the smell of the leaves on the ground. I love the sounds of the world away from civilization. I always feel rested afterwards. Psychology might explain why. Many psychologists suggest that people go "forest bathing" once a week. Forest bathing in when we immerse ourselves in greenery and nature. According to some psychology, humans have long associated the color green and the sight of trees with safety and calm. That is why we find it restful to be in the wood, because somewhere in our brains we feel secure.

I completely agree with that assessment. And I think there is an even better one for why hiking does so much for me. In the wilderness we are more open to God. That seems to be the case for some many people throughout human history. That includes Jesus: News of him spread even more and huge crowds gathered to listen and to be healed from their ill-nesses. But Jesus would withdraw to deserted places for prayer. (Luke 5:15-16 CEB).

Jesus went into the desert to pray. We don't have many deserts around here, so if the gospel was set in PA then we would say Jesus hiked to the top of a mountain to pray. Why go through all that effort when you can pray anywhere? Jesus knew what we often forget: in the wilderness we are more open to God. When we physically go away from all the distractions of life, it is so much easier to connect more deeply with out God. Jesus knew that, and now we are reminded of that too.

This month marks the beginning of Lent. Ash Wednesday is February 14. That is also valentine's day. Those two might seem like they clash at first, but I think they fit together well actually. Lent is the time to focus more deeply on growing closer to God. Often that means repentance, turning away or putting down the things that stop of from getting close to God. That repentance is kind of like saying "no" to a bunch of other plans so you can have a date night with your partner. In the same way, Lent is about doing our darndest to fall more deeply in love with God, often by saying "no" to something else.

This is your reminder that falling more in love with God will probably involve finding your own wilderness. It will involve finding your own way of saying "no" to other things so you can focus on God. It will involve finding your own way of getting away from distractions. For me, that involves hiking in literal wilderness. For you that might involve going to be alone in your room to pray. It may involve helping other people in God's name when you normally don't have time to do that. It may involve putting our phones down, or turning our tv's off, and just being present to our God. Whatever wilderness may look like for you, seek it out this Lent, and fall even more deeply in love with our amazing God. Amen






